Grade 8 students are discussing ways they can demonstrate proficiency with transferable skills in citizenship combined with Next Generation Science Standards in Ecology.

Staff and students noticed the fallen tree limb on the apple tree on campus.

Students were excited to take the opportunity to engage in campus based service learning as identified by the citizenship standard below by collecting the apples, clearing the brush from the fallen tree, and cutting up the larger trunk to donate as firewood.

Students are collecting the apples to make various apple products (pies, sauce, and cider), and grow trees from seed. This is something they do every year as part of a seasonal unit on Vermont's apple heritage

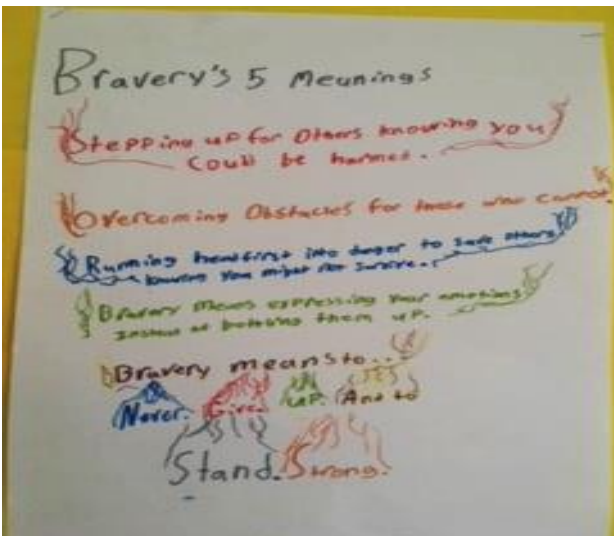
Being Brave in a New School Year:
