WHY RESTORATIVE ACTS?

When using the tools of Restorative Practices, school administrators recognize that when a student makes a mistake, it's a golden opportunity for learning --- a "teachable moment". Along with that comes the understanding and acceptance that it's developmentally appropriate for young people to make mistakes. When behaviors are misguided, thoughtless or even meanspirited, these incidents become opportunities for learning rather than pathways to punishment. Times like these are ideal ways to practice and integrate the skills of empathy, accountability and reparation.
